### Secondary Pick-Up Reminders

We are seeing an increasing number of parents parking on Sharmin to pick up their children. This is creating a lot of congestion on this road, both for ACA parents and students but also neighbors. Please remember that all parents should be coming through the carline. If you are not picking up in carline, you need to park on 2nd Avenue or on Sharmin behind 2nd. We have had several near accidents lately with parents pulling around parked cars or cars not being able to get through safely on Sharmin.

Also, if you are parking south of the gym, please be mindful of the staff directing traffic. Our main goal is to get the parents in carline out first, as they back up on the road and it's not safe. Please follow the instructions of the staff and be patient as we prioritize getting our carline off the street.

Please share this reminder also with grandparents or others picking up your children.

## Elementary Drop-Off Reminder

Your child's safety is so important to us. If at all possible, please drop-off your child outside of the rear passenger door. If that is not possible, please use extra caution when they exit outside the driver side doors. Also, please use extreme caution when driving through the parking lot. Please do not come down the middle aisle or drop off your child in a handicapped spot. Please go through the carline for the safety of all of our students.

### Intruder Drill - Note for Kindergarten & Begindergarten Parents

ACA will be practicing for a run, hide, fight drill next week. We want to provide our kindergarten and begindergarten parents with a few thoughts as this may be the first time they practice something like this. Here is the verbiage our kindergarten and begindergarten teachers will share:

If something "unsafe" is in our school, we might need to leave until emergency workers like police, firefighters, or animal catchers can make it safe again. For example, if a skunk got into our school, we wouldn't want to welcome him in our room. A wild animal doesn't belong in our school! He would make a big stink! The teacher will decide if it's safest to go outside until he's caught or lock our door and hide inside. The same thing would happen if a dangerous person came into our school. This will be referenced but the emphasis will be on the animal example so that the children focus on a less scary scenario.

#### **Event Schedule**

- Monday October 20th 7PM
- Wednesday October 22nd 7PM
- Monday October 27th 7PM

#### **Tickets**

- All spectators (including students K-12) must purchase a ticket for each event night through BOUND.
- · No re-entry allowed: Once spectators have scanned their ticket and entered the building, they may not leave

and return.

#### **Spectator Expectations**

The Iowa Girls' High School Athletic Union (IGHSAU) has outlined expectations for all spectators. These rules will be strictly enforced by ACA staff.

Unacceptable Behavior (Subject to Ejection)

- Profanity, obscene gestures, disrespectful or inappropriate comments.
- Throwing objects onto the court.
- Entering the court area for any reason.
- Physical altercations or confrontations.
- Spectator interference or disruptions.
- Use of laser pointers.

#### Dress Code.

- Full masks (hidden identity) are not allowed.
- Face paint is allowed.

#### Cheers & Chants

- Chants or cheers directed at the opponent are prohibited.
  - First Offense: WarningSecond Offense: Ejection

#### Signs & Noisemakers

- The following items are NOT allowed:
  - Banners, signs, flags, balloons, placards, Fatheads
  - Confetti, pom-poms on sticks, fake swords
  - Artificial noisemakers: airhorns, cowbells, keys, megaphones, thunder sticks
- Allowed items:
  - Rally towels (14"x14")
  - · Foam fingers
  - Face/body paint
- Regular season signage may remain in place, but no new signs may be added.

#### Post-Game Protocol

- No spectators (including parents) are allowed on the playing floor after the match until players have cleared the playing floor.
- The host school is responsible for ensuring the safety of players, officials, and staff.
- Each school is responsible for the behavior of its own fans and students.

#### Live Streaming

• Live streaming is not permitted unless approved by the IGHSAU.

### **Debt Service Vote**

We are excited to share an important opportunity for the future of our school. ACA is in the process of finalizing the purchase of the apartment buildings located directly east of our campus. To move forward, we will be holding a **debt service vote** to approve financing for this purchase.

Per our by-laws, this vote will authorize ACA to secure a loan to complete the transaction. We invite all eligible parents to join us for a time of Q&A followed by the vote.

#### **Frequently Asked Questions**

#### When will the vote take place?

The vote will be held on Thursday, October 23 at 6:30 PM in the ACA Auditorium. We will begin with a Q&A session, followed by the vote.

#### Will absentee voting be available?

No. Voting will take place in person only following the Q&A session.

#### Who is eligible to vote?

Voting is open to **association members**, defined in our by-laws as parents or guardians of a currently enrolled ACA student.

#### What is the purchase price of the apartment buildings?

ACA is purchasing the properties at 110, 114, and 118 NW State Street, as well as 1606 NW 2nd Street, for a total of \$2,560,000.

#### What are the loan amount and terms?

ACA plans to finance up to \$2,000,000 of the purchase price. Loan terms are still being finalized. The debt service will represent approximately 3% of our annual operating budget, which will be covered by existing funds. We also anticipate using rental income from the units to help offset loan payments while they remain leased.

#### How will the apartments be managed?

The properties will be owned by a separate ACA-owned LLC and managed by a third-party property management company.

We encourage all eligible parents to attend and participate in this important decision for our school's future. If you have questions prior to the meeting, please don't hesitate to reach out. Thank you for your continued support and partnership.
